Mary Kononenko joined Penn in 2000. She began her career in the College of Arts and Sciences where she coordinated the College Graduation Ceremony for several years. Currently she is an Associate Director of the Biobehavioral and Health Sciences Department in the School of Nursing. She has been a member of the University Club since coming to Penn and enjoys the Club atmosphere and getting together with friends. It would be an honor to serve on the Board.

Ms. Kononenko will complete a two-year unexpired term.

Marguerite Miller has been editor of *Almanac* since 1999. Joining Penn in 1980, she began as assistant editor of *Almanac* and was promoted to associate editor in 1986. She brought Penn's weekly journal of record, opinion and news to a worldwide audience via the Internet in 1995, launched *Express Almanac* – an electronic mailing list in 2000 and has led efforts to enhance *Almanac's* website integrating the electronic and print editions.

Ms. Miller has also contributed to University life and governance, including having served as secretary of the A-1 Assembly, 1988-1989 (now PPSA).

For over a decade, she has supervised local high school students in the school-to-work program and the summer youth program and has been a Shadowing Day mentor for many years.

She has attended the Penn Perspective and the Penn Supervisor, among other programs over the years. She was inducted into the University's 25 Year Club at the annual dinner in October 2005.

Since 2006, she has served on the Martin Luther King Jr. Commemorative Symposium

Executive Planning Committee and Public Relations Committee as well as coordinating the Day of Service Literacy Project to put books on tape for Philadelphia Reads.

She has served two three-year terms, since 2005, on the University Club's Board of Governors. Ms. Miller has been a member of the Club since 1993.

Other community service also included serving on the Board of Directors of The Caring Center from 1991 to 1994. From 1995-2000 she was the vice president of the Paddock Park Civic Association in Havertown.

She took her B.A. in Communications from The American University in 1976 and served as the communications director of the Retail Bakers of America, a trade association in the Washington, D.C. area, from 1977 to 1979.

John Rudolph has been employed in the Student Employment Office for the past 24 years. As manager, he is primarily responsible for overseeing the on and off campus work-study programs. John currently serves as president of the Board. He strongly supports the University Club, and believes that the Club is the only place on campus where we can come together as a Penn community to enjoy lunch with our colleagues.

Anthony Tomazinis received his Ph.D. in City Planning from Penn in 1963. He now serves as Emeritus Professor of City Planning and Director of TRANSLAB of the GSFA. He served as chairman of the DCRP, as chair of the Graduate Group (Ph.D.) in City and Regional Planning, as Chairman and Director of the Program of Dynamics of Organization, and as Chairman of the Faculty Senate of the University. He still serves in the Executive Committee of the Senate. Dr. Tomazinis is a strong supporter of strong faculty organizations, of an active University Club for the faculty and staff, effectively supported by the University and its Faculty, and with greater faculty participation.

Paul Weidner has been employed at the University of Pennsylvania for 20 years, currently serving as Director of Financial Training in the Division of Finance. As director, he is primarily responsible for designing and delivering programs focused on the University's financial processes, procedures and systems, including BEN Financials and the HR/Payroll application. Paul previously held positions in Wharton External Affairs and in the School of Medicine Dean's Office. He has served on the board, and is a past chairperson, of the Association of Business Administrators.
